



Artist - Charles Fazzino

Charles Fazzino, graduate of the School of Visual Arts in New York City is one of the most popular and highly-collected pop artists of all time. During his more-than-thirty years as a pop artist, he has inserted his unique, detailed, vibrant, and three-dimensional style of artwork into the very fabric of popular culture. Fazzino's artworks are exhibited in hundreds of museums and galleries in more than twenty different countries.

Isambard Kingdom Brunel

Brunel was one of the most fearless and talented engineers of the 19th century, responsible for the design of tunnels, bridges, railway lines and ships

The work for which Brunel is probably best remembered is his construction of a network of tunnels, bridges and viaducts for the Great Western Railway.

George Stephenson

Stephenson was a pioneering railway engineer and inventor of the 'Rocket', the most famous early railway steam locomotive.

In 1814, Stephenson constructed his first locomotive, 'Blucher', for hauling coal at Killingworth Colliery near Newcastle. In 1815, he invented a safety lamp for use in coalmines, nicknamed the 'Geordie'.
